It's Monday 4th June and I am pleased to report that it is a lovely hot sunny day here in Devon – hopefully you are all experiencing similar conditions. Goa, however, is preparing for the monsoons and the 'pre-monsoon' rains have already started. Today is also the day when the schools return after their six-week break and when eleven children from our schools will be starting at the government schools. No doubt it will be a traumatic day for them but I am sure you will join me in wishing them every success and with hard work a bright new future.

Project reports:

Damedem.

Some of the children and some of the staff became ill with chicken pox but I am happy to tell you that they have all now recovered. Unfortunately with the onset of the monsoon season a number of them are suffering from heavy colds, which can make them very sick. This is more pronounced the older they get and the more their virus develops. To make life more bearable for these children we have just built a sick / isolation bay where they can be nursed in peace and quiet away from the other thirteen boys and girls.

Two weeks ago little Laxmi fell down the steps and broke her leg so she has been slowed down with a plaster cast. We wish her a speedy recovery.

Sisters in Holy Orders are regularly moved around to fulfil the Churches commitment to the poor and needy and Sister Flora has now moved on to a school in South Goa. We wish her well in her new position and look forward to hearing from her regularly.

Starting Point.

Today should see the start of new children to replace those who have graduated to the state schools. Life in the slums will not have taught them to use a chair, desk or anything connected to school. They often take weeks to adjust, especially to using 'western style' toilets – many are frightened to sit on the loo seat for fear that they will fall down the hole and never been seen again!!! They will no doubt welcome the two course meal they will receive each day but often frown at being wormed each week and being subjected to treatment for head lice.

At last a company has been found who can supply playground equipment so hopefully soon the children will have a slide, seesaw, trampoline, push along car and swing. It is India so it may take some time to get them installed but as soon as possible I will send photos to those of you who have donated towards the playground.

We will also need to repaint the school once the monsoon has finished.
