Hello to you all from a very sunny Devon where it would appear summer has arrived. Having enjoyed at least ten days of fine weather we are promised at least a further week of sunshine with temperatures reaching the mid-twenties!!! Hopefully you too are enjoying similar weather.

Day Care Centre.

Two additional children have been taken on but I do not have their details as yet. Everything seems to be going smoothly – fortunately the doctors are capable of running the centre without much input from the charity.

The repairs to the roof and the alterations to the entrance have been completed and we hope there will be no leaks during the monsoons!

Some new equipment is required but as this is not commercially available locally we have to get a carpenter to make it usually from diagrams found in magazines.

Starting Point.

The school reopens on June 5th following the summer break – just in time for the start of the monsoon season which is expected to reach Goa on June 7th.

As with previous years the children enjoyed a day out to beach with the students from Braintree College in March.

Jane's son Eron has been in hospital in Goa for five weeks with a renal problem but as the main hospital in Goa were unable to resolve the problem he was transferred to a Mumbai hospital 400 miles away which necessitated flying there. Hopefully the problem has been sorted but unfortunately in India there is no National Health service and the cost to Jane & Xavier has exceeded £1500! Jane has asked me to express her thanks to those of you who have made donations towards these costs. If anyone else would like to contribute to these costs please let me know.

Educational Sponsorship Scheme.

The five children (Girls Jolenta, Sneha & Saniya & boys Sushil & Rihann) who have graduated from Starting Point will start their respective schools in early June. They will be attending at Little Flower or St. Teresa's schools and they go with our very best wishes.

Some of the older children will be starting their final year at school providing they do not continue into higher education and possibly university.

There are three new arrivals - two boys Govind who is an 11 yr old orphan from Hubli, Kartic a 12 yr old local boy and Yamuna a 12 yr old girl who originates from Karnatica. Unfortunately Yamuna is not well and has spent the last week in hospital but is expected to return to Damedem later this week.

I am sad to tell you that Str Jessie will be leaving us on 15th June 2013. She is being transferred by the church to Karnatica where she will be working in an old people's home. Having been with the HIV home for ten years she will be sadly missed by both the staff and especially the children some of who have been with her since they were only weeks old. I am sure you will join me in wishing her all the very best in her new post – we will of course keep in contact with her.

Hazel is now the longest serving member of Damedem and will be in great demand until Sister Jessie's replacement is 'up to speed' with the working of the home but Hazel is due to return to the UK in early August.
